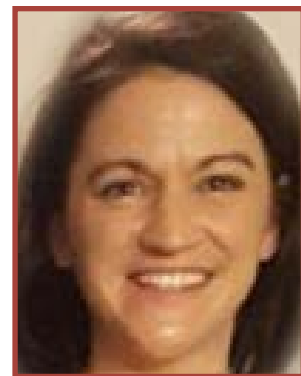
Please plan to join us for Unpack the Backpack night from 4-6 PM on Wednesday, August 22nd. You can purchase used uniforms, check out volunteer opportunities, deposit money into your lunch account, visit your child’s classroom, and much more.

Home and School is our “Catholic school” version of PTA. The single main fundraiser sponsored by Home and School is SCRIP. What is SCRIP? Our Home and School volunteers sell gift cards called “SCRIP” every week. Vendors sell those gift cards to Home and School at a discount, so they are essentially giving back to the school a certain percentage of whatever we sell. Watch for more information about how to make online SCRIP purchases!

School starts at 8:30 AM for K-8 students on August 23rd. However, students may be dropped off as early as 8:00 AM. Dismissal is at 3:20 PM, except Wednesdays when dismissal is at 2:30 PM. AM preschool and prekindergarten is from 8:30 AM – 11:30 AM, and PM prekindergarten is from 12:20-3:20 PM.

Back-To-School Procedures

K-8 Drop off:

K-8 students should be dropped off between 8:00 and 8:20 AM.

Enter the church/school parking lot via Brown Street and stay in the car line along the curb.

When it is your turn, a greeter will assist in getting your child out of the car and off to their designated area of the courtyard.

Staff supervisors are on duty from 8:00 until 8:20 for each designated area.

PS/PreK Drop off:

Morning preschool and prekindergarten students should arrive between 8:30 and 8:40 AM. Afternoon prekindergarten students should arrive between 12:20 and 12:30 PM.

Parents pull vehicles up on Mississippi Blvd.

Greeters will assist in getting your child out of the car and up the steps into the school.

K-8 Pick up:

K-8 students and afternoon prekindergarten students are dismissed at 3:20.

Students exit into the courtyard and are instructed to wait for their parents.

Parents are to enter the parking lot via Mississippi Blvd. between 3:00 and 3:20 PM.

Park your vehicle in a space, pulling all the way through.

Parents walk up to the coned-off area and escort students by the hand to their vehicle.

When leaving, do not reverse; pull straight ahead and exit the parking lot into Brown Street.

PS/PreK Pick up:

AM students are dismissed at the giving tree/parking lot area at 11:30 AM.

PM students are dismissed at the giving tree/parking lot area at 3:20 PM.

AM parents, enter from Brown Street and park your car in the south half of the lot. Walk up to your child's teacher and escort your child by the hand to your parked vehicle.

PM parents, enter the parking lot via Mississippi Blvd. and park your vehicle in a space, pulling all the way through.

Walk up to the coned-off area and escort your child by the hand to your parked vehicle. When leaving, do not reverse; pull straight ahead and exit the parking lot into Brown Street.

Dress Code Guidelines

Uniforms:

Girls K-4 Plaid jumper, skirt or culotte

Girls 5-8 Plaid skirt or culotte

Length = No shorter than 2 inches above the knee. Cut, torn, or ripped clothing is not allowed.

Girls/Boys Pants:

Solid navy or tan dress slacks

Belts must be worn in grades 3-8.

Pants should be hemmed to the top of the shoe.

No jeans, cotton knits, stirrups, elastic at the ankle, cargo pants, carpenter pants, or capri pants.

Shorts:

Navy blue or tan walking shorts (2 inches above the knee)

May ONLY be worn August thru November 15th and April 1st thru the end of the school year.

Shorts should be just above the knee. No boxers, cotton knits, lycra, or cargo shorts.

Shirts:

Red, white or navy blue classic polo shirts or turtlenecks. (Middle School only can wear light blue.)

Classic polo shirts are full bodied - traditional long- or short-sleeved.

Shirts should be tucked in on both girls and boys at all times.

No logo or LCS logo only is allowed.

Plain, white shirts may be worn under uniform shirts.

For NUT Day, shirts must have sleeves and shoulders must be covered.

Spirit Day:

Every Friday! LCS spirit wear and Assumption High School spirit wear may also be worn.

N.U.T. Day:

N.U.T. stands for "No Uniform Today." When there is a scheduled N.U.T. Day, students are allowed to be out of uniform on this day. There are still guidelines to be followed on these special days. Students must still follow the sections above on: Shorts, Shoes, Hairstyles, Jewelry, and Make-Up.

Top FIVE questions about the BOE:

1) What is the Board of Education?

We oversee the administration, budget, and operation of the school. The board does not handle the day to day operation of the school, rather this is the job of the principal, staff, and teachers. In addition to the school, we also oversee the religious education programs for the Our Lady of Lourdes parish.

2) Who is on the Board of Education?

The voting members of the board are twelve individuals who represent all children attending educational programming at Our Lady of Lourdes. Any Parish member 18 years or older or parent/guardian of a child attending LCS is allowed to serve as a board member. There are a range of ex-officio members of our board too. Our current membership can be found on the LCS website.

3) When does the Board meet?

We typically meet on the third Tuesday of the month at 6:00 PM, but see the website for the specific dates/times. We send our agenda out to the community at least two days before the meeting. We hold open meetings and anyone can attend. Occasionally we do go into closed session and only elected members participate in this part of our meeting. We usually post our minutes on the website within 2 weeks of our meeting.

4) Do I have to be on the Board to assist?

The board has subcommittees that work on marketing, grant writing, policies, and the budget. We welcome people who are not on the board to assist on these subcommittees. If you have an interest, reach out to the board president or principal.

5) What if I have an issue for the Board?

Parents should feel comfortable asking questions and sharing input with any board member. We also hold open forums at the start of our meetings to hear from members of our community. Based on the situation we may refer you to speak to a teacher, the principal, or someone else at the school. If you have questions about what the board does and does not handle you can speak to the board president and he or she can help guide you in the right direction.

Youth Ministry

Our Lady of Lourdes will be sponsoring a number of Youth Ministry events throughout the year. Middle School Youth Nights are open to all 6th - 8th grade students, in Catholic school, public school, or friends. These youth nights will consist of fellowship, games, and content surrounding a particular theme related to life and faith. Nights will be held in the Gym (unless otherwise noted) from 6:15 - 7:30 p.m. The High School Youth Nights are more religious discussions with other Catholic high schoolers.

Youth Alpha Series walk through the basic Christian principles in an open and honest dialogue with food from 6-8 PM while the adult session is also running.

There are also upcoming conferences that the youth can go to. NCYC are for any youth and there will be some fundraisers for that event. The Holy Fire in Chicago is an exciting one-day program for sixth through eighth graders that promotes a continuous encounter with Jesus Christ. At Holy Fire, youth participate in activities centered around prayer, witness and joy that perpetuate the concept of becoming missionary disciples who are not afraid to witness the faith. Ultimately, Holy Fire helps young people to see themselves as witnesses of Christ and vital members of a young Church.

Remember to Purchase SCRIP every Tuesday and Friday!

Q: What is SCRIP?

A: SCRIP is a year-round fundraiser. You buy pre-paid cards for local and online stores, and the school gets a % of sales.

Q: I don't like giving gift cards as gifts, why should I buy SCRIP?

A: Don't think of SCRIP just for gift-giving. Purchase these cards for all of your regular shopping—Target, Starbucks, Friday night pizza, gas, etc.

Q: I do most of my shopping online, can I use SCRIP?

A: Absolutely! We have SCRIP cards for Amazon and so many other online retailers.

Q: Who runs the SCRIP program?

A: Parent volunteers—and we still need more! We are always looking for parents who can help fill orders or pick up the cards from the various stores. We are also looking for volunteers to sell after Mass at Lourdes and St. John Vianney. Contact Donica Mocosak (dm525@icloud.com) if you're interested in helping out!

Q: How do I purchase SCRIP?

A: The order form is accessible via the school website, or picked up in the school office. Send the completed form with cash or check in your child's backpack, the order will be filled on Tuesday and/or Friday morning, and sent home in your child's backpack! There are a few businesses that we don't keep in stock, those will be ordered and filled ASAP. SCRIP is also sold after Masses in the gathering space.

Q: Can only Lourdes parents order SCRIP?

A: No! Feel free to hand out order forms to grandma and grandpa, aunts and uncles. You can collect their money and turn it in with your own orders. We will even mail their SCRIP order back to them if you'd like!

Q: What does SCRIP pay for?
