

SCRIP is on sale every Tuesday and Friday at school in the mornings, and many are kept in stock so you don't need to wait. Download our in-stock <u>order form</u> to see what is available. Through the profits our school earns with SCRIP, many field trips and educational technologies are made a reality.

Lourdes Catholic School has a Wellness Policy that must be followed. If you have not seen the Wellness Policy, you can check it out <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>. If you child's homeroom teacher allows birthday treats, you must make sure that the treat you provide is appropriate for any child in the homeroom who has allergies. Check with the homeroom teacher. Store-packaged items with a nutrition label showing that calories, sodium, and fat are in compliance with guidelines are required. We also encourage creative, non-food birthday treats.

#### Home & School President's Corner — Nicki Johnson

I hope everyone had a great October! I was recently reviewing the mission of Home & School and it prompted me to talk about SCRIP in this message. Part of our mission is to "support the school and all of those within through fundraising". SCRIP and Starry Night are our main fundraisers and I think sometimes SCRIP is confusing to people.

SCRIP is simply gift cards in exchange for cash. When you purchase these gift cards, the store or restaurant then turns around and donates a percent of the sale to our school. This is our main school fundraiser that pays for playground equipment, field trips, technology, art supplies, individual teacher needs, etc.

If you aren't already aware, our 2016-17 SCRIP sales goal is \$500,000 and our profit goal is \$15,000. As of September 30th, our SCRIP sales are \$47,990 and our SCRIP profit is \$4,128. We are behind in our sales goal, but ahead in our overall profit goal. We're averaging 8.5% per sale which is more than our estimate of 3%. This is great news to start out the year!

#### How your family can help us meet our SCRIP goal -

- We have 146 families (K-8).
- Our SCRIP sales goal for 2016-17 is \$500,000 in sales or \$15,000 in profit.
- To meet our goal each family would need to purchase \$3424 of SCRIP or \$103 of profit annually to reach our goal.
- This family monthly goal would be \$380 total purchase or \$12 of profit monthly (over a 9 month school year).
- \$380 is easy to spend each month with \$200 from Hyvee, \$100 from Shell, \$50 from Amazon, \$20 at Wise Guys pizza and \$10 at Whitey's.

Of course we always are striving to exceed, not just meet our goals, to provide more for our school and children. Thank you for your participation so far and please continue to participate at the same or even higher levels that you have in the past.

#### From the LCS Library - Birthday Books

The birthday book program is an optional program in which students can purchase a new book for the library with a \$5.00 donation. A special sticker with the students name and birth date is placed in the front cover of the book. The birthday



student is the first one to check it out and a photo is placed on the bulletin board so that other students can see the collection of new books that have been donated so far this year.

#### **Lourdes Library Catalog**

Students can utilize the Lourdes Catholic School <u>library catalog</u> anywhere they have internet access. The catalog can be searched by title, author, subject, series and numerous variables from reading level to interest level. If we own a title, the catalog provides a description, the subject/genre, reading level, interest level, page length, **reading counts quiz level & points,** if applicable and if it is currently available for check out!

#### A note from the nurse's office - Mrs. Huiskamp

Cold and flu season is soon approaching; here are some guidelines at Lourdes to help keep our students from spreading their colds.

Please keep your child home if he/she shows any of the following signs:

- 1. FEVER of 100 or greater students must be fever free for 24 hrs. without medication before returning to school.
- 2. VOMITING or frequent Diarrhea 24 hrs. must elapse without vomiting before students may return to school.
- 3. Frequent uncontrolled COUGH.

When your child is home sick from school, please call the school office to report the absence. When calling the school to report the absence, please give at least two symptoms of your child's illness. This information is reported to the Health Department daily in order to track illnesses. The only information given to the Health Department is the number of sick students and their symptoms.

Many of you have heard of "Eggly"...we even have an Eggly pumpkin in our contest this year. Here is Mrs. Volden's story, of how Eggly came to be one your child's favorite learning friends....

It is an honor to be asked to write a newsletter article regarding the history of Voweletics' development and its theory for teaching children to read. Voweletics is the supplemental reading program used at Lourdes to teach foundational reading skills in our primary grades. As the founder, here is my story......



Through my teaching, tutoring and desire to provide positive learning-to-read experiences, my entrepreneurial spirit began with a plan to write a book series that emphasized life values. The book series was to be written with decodable words to make reading little, life-lesson books easy for young children. I wanted joyful, meaningful reading books for early readers. They were intended to emphasize values such as kindness, gratitude and a positive attitude. I kept a journal filled with ideas for the characters and story topics.

During this time, I tutored children in early reading skills. In fact, many of our former Lourdes students who are now in high school or college, were my students. Does that age me terribly?!? Repeatedly, parents would say their favorite part of the tutoring session was the five minutes at the end of the tutoring session. Parents were asked to come into my home so I could go over step-by-step the reading skill we practiced that day. Parents are a child's strongest advocate. I felt strongly that when parents understood exactly how to help their child, children always improved their reading skills. Developing a love for reading together AND being equipped with phonetic rules to give their child a boost, makes all the difference for children.

I soon realized that the first need to be met should be to provide the reading tools, so the direction changed in the creative development. The original book characters became the vowel sound guidewords and their values were written into the teaching text. My talented daughter Kate, drew the characters and designed all the graphics for the teaching content; while I created the content and the songs both for the character values and the essential reading rules children need in order to sound out words. Being a variety show girl all my life, what could be more fun than to do this through song? Readersville was created where good readers go to learn to read and have fun doing it!

Hence, Voweletics evolved over the past 10 years into both a phonetic reading and spelling curriculum for primary grades in schools and a home product for parents looking for a way to help their children with reading. Originally called the BuddyUp Reading Program, parent/child buddies would attend a ten-week course at the Bettendorf Community Center. Parents and children embraced the program and children experienced great reading improvement, so the learning method was refined and a patent application process begun.

The patent attorney urged us to create a more novel name. So immediately following our meeting, Kate and I went to our usual spot where creative ideas always seemed to flow....Azteca. J While sharing chips, salsa and a side order of guacamole, Voweletics™ The New Phonetics came to fruition. Knowing the vowel sounds is THE hardest part of learning to read. Voweletics teaches to the 18 different vowel sounds in our English language and the seven associated vowel pattern rules to know when to use these varying vowel sounds. Etics..the study of... hmmmmm...the vowels! Voweletics seemed a perfect name for the teaching method. BuddyUp Reading transformed into BU Publishing, L.L.C. that now publishes Voweletics. Plans are still underway to come full circle to write whimsical books with the Voweletics characters showing residents in Readersville how to treat others with kindness and express good life values. My personal journal continues to grow with ideas.

The magnitude of gratitude I have for Lourdes Catholic School administrators, teachers, parents and children is immense. At Lourdes, I was able to take an idea, develop it and run with it ONLY because of the support of so many people in our Lourdes family. Thank you for love I feel here every day and the opportunity to allow me to grow Voweletics at our school.
