Greetings, Families!

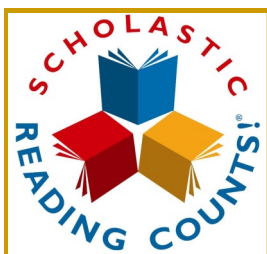

Scholastic Reading Counts

Scholastic Reading Counts supports student learning by assessing their reading level, recommending reading lists at their level and evaluating their progress through a computerized comprehension quiz each time they complete a book.

Reading Counts provides quizzes for over 64,000 books in an effort to support reading growth. By choosing books at the correct reading level, students continue to see improvement with each quiz they pass. It is an excellent way to encourage reading and monitor student growth.

<http://src.scholastic.com/ecatalog/> is a searchable database that provides information about the books that have a quiz. It is a great tool for students, teachers & parents in helping select reading material at the appropriate reading and interest level. Students can use this database to check and see if any of the books they are reading at home have a reading counts quiz.



Not all teachers use Reading Counts as a mandatory part of their curriculum, but all students have an account and are welcome to take a quiz on any book they read. They can do this during free reading time or during library. Reading Counts Quizzes can only be taken at school due to accountability purposes. The catalog can be searched by title, author, subject, series and numerous variables from reading level to interest level. If we own a title the catalog provides a description, the subject/genre, reading level, interest level, page length, reading counts quiz level & points if applicable and if it is currently available for check out.

Battle of the Books

The goal of “Battle of the Books” is to promote reading at the middle school level. The book list is made up of a collection of 24 titles, which are



preselected each year by our teachers. The books are a variety of genres, reading levels and sizes so that students are exposed to diverse literature.

Teams consist of 3 or 4 students. Each team is responsible for reading all 24 books. It is part of the curriculum for students in grades 6th & 7th grades but 5th graders are chosen if they are gifted readers, want an extra challenge, and enjoy reading outside their normal classroom assignments. It is optional for 8th graders although they are encouraged to participate. At the end of the school year student groups compete against one another in a quiz bowl, answering questions about the Battle Books. The final 3 teams are awarded monetary prizes as well as a sense of pride in team effort, cooperation and commitment.

SCRIP Q & A:

Q: What is SCRIP?

A: SCRIP is a year-round fundraiser. You buy pre-paid cards for local and online stores, and the school gets a % of sales.

Q: I don't like giving gift cards as gifts, why should I buy SCRIP?

A: Don't think of SCRIP just for gift-giving. Purchase these cards for all of your regular shopping—Target, Starbucks, Friday night pizza, gas, etc..

Q: I do most of my shopping online, can I use SCRIP?

A: Absolutely! We have SCRIP cards for Amazon and so many other online retailers.

Q: Who runs the SCRIP program?

A: Parent volunteers—and we still need more! We are always looking for parents who can help fill orders or pick up the cards from the various stores. We are also looking for volunteers to sell after Mass at Lourdes and St. John Vianney. Email Ms. Alongi if you're interested in helping out!

Q: How do I purchase SCRIP?

A: The order form can be printed off of our school [website](#), or picked up in the school office. Send the completed form with cash or check in your child's backpack, the order will be filled on Tuesday or Friday morning, and sent home in your child's backpack! There are a few businesses that we don't keep in stock, those will be ordered and filled ASAP. SCRIP is also sold after Masses in the gathering space.

Q: Can only Lourdes parents order SCRIP?

A: No! Feel free to hand out order forms to grandma and grandpa, aunts and uncles. You can collect their money and turn it in with your own orders. We will even mail their SCRIP order back to them if you'd like!

Summer is a busy time for me juggling data entry, clearing up accounts, updating software for the new school year and church year; the list goes on. I have also taken on the financial analysis for the lunch program and working together with David Weaver the Kitchen Manager.

You can check your [lunch account](#) balance online, throughout the year.

The lunch program for the 2016-2017 as you know is in full swing and our prices are \$3.15 for student lunches, \$0.45 for milk only and \$1.50 for an extra entrée which is open to all ages K-8. As a courtesy, we will be billing notices every other week with \$10.00 worth of funds remaining on account as a reminder that funds are getting low. Unfortunately, we do not have an online payment option for making lunch payments but we accept cash, check, and credit card. Cash and check payments can be sent in your child's backpack, take home folder or may be dropped in the money box across from the school office front window. Please notate on your checks memo line that it is for the lunch program and provide the child's name. Same holds true for cash payments so we can accurately apply your payment to the correct account. Feel free to stop in the school office to replenish your lunch account using a Mastercard or Visa credit card. 11TH ANNUAL OLOL MASS IN THE PARK Saturday, October 1, 5 pm

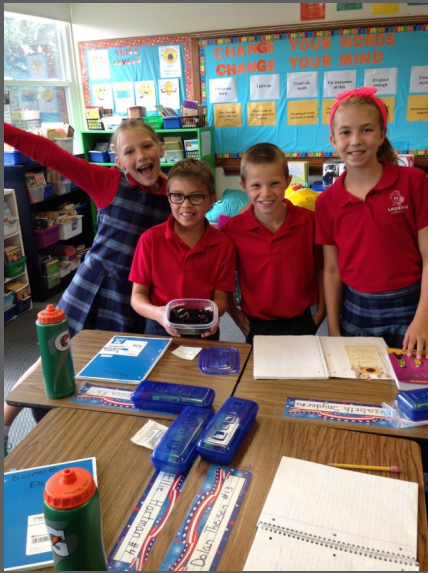
Join us at Veteran’s Memorial Park Bandshell, Bettendorf. There will be a cookout following Mass.

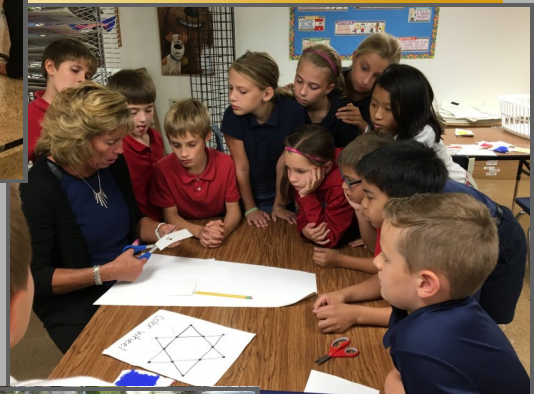
