- 1. Call to Order Meeting called to order at 6:34pm by Karen Moldt
- **2. Opening Prayer –** offered by Fr. Chris Weber
- 3. Introduction of Guests Tony Lemek (board alternate), Myriam Wilson (parent), Joe Camarena (Parent), Brooke Heckinger (Parent), Shannon Heck (Teacher)
- **4. Approval of Agenda –** Motion offered by Ms. Heden, second by Mrs. Mokosak. Motion passed.
- **5. Approval Minutes –** Minutes approved electronically by majority vote.
- 6. Open Forum
  - 1. **Kris Derscha** Photo booth discussion photos from fall festival were posted online for a brief period, unadvertised, and have since been removed due to privacy concerns. Similarly, the hard copy that was provided to the church will be destroyed.
  - 2. Joe Camarena Concerns regarding 4-year-old pre-k students receiving less religion because Lourdes is a state funded program. Concern with fewer prayers during instructional time. Faith is why we are here. 10hours/week must be 'public' education, which leaves 2 hours per week available for faith formation. Faith Fridays program is not adequate to 'fill the bucket' for the week. At a minimum, there needs to be prayers before meal time or snack time.

Response: Ms. Alongi – requirement to pray before meals has been shared with three pre-k teachers. We are required to have 10 hours per week secular instructional time.

We actually provide two hours of instruction beyond that ten hours, which can be used for religious instruction. Bettendorf officials have observed Pre-K teachers praying with students before snack and have not said we need to stop. Ms. Alongi will check with teachers to make sure that there have not been complaints from parents about having prayer times. By taking money from state, we cannot turn away students of other faiths. We would need to change policy to let go of state funding. Can explore as a board going forward to determine if that is something we want to do.

Response: Ms. Lackey – We need to determine why we aren't saying prayers in class.

Question: Mr. Camarena – Can't we still have a small amount of time per day for religious education?

Response: Ms. Alongi agreed to meet with teachers to further understand issue. Will follow back up with Mr. Camerena after discussion with teachers.

Fr. Weber has requested further information on Bettendorf policies.

- 3. Myriam Wilson Question about children of other faiths in K-8. Suggests having a policy in place for new parents of children of other faiths. Tell them up front what expectations are.
  - a. Why is pre-k only four days and not five days? If teachers are paid for 5 days, why are they only teaching 4 days?
    - i. Ms. Alongi Teachers must assess 38 objectives which are required for each child in pre-k. There is too much work to be done in the work week to complete state requirements (Gold Assessments) without working on Saturdays. A decision was made to reduce the number of days but increase the amount of instructional time each day from 2.5 to 3 hours to allow for assessment tasks, lesson planning, of instructional time to allow for administrative tasks and for professional development to be completed.
  - b. Why are other schools in 5-day programs? Why is it working there but not here?
    - i. Ms. Alongi We don't know that it is, they could be working Saturdays and we don't know.
  - c. Comment about Kindergarten 25 kids in one class is too many. It's not fair to kids or to teachers. Kids who had small classes last year are not getting same attention in 1<sup>st</sup> grade with larger class sizes. (General concern for next year.)
    - i. **Ms.** Alongi We send out surveys early in the year to try and get an idea of how many kids are interested in Lourdes. The number 25 is in line with public and private schools in the area. Bettendorf has capped at 22 students, but there is no aid in those classes.
    - ii. Fr. Crossen Even though we split Kindergarten in the past, we were losing over \$100,000/year. We would not be able to sustain the school at this rate. We had to make decisions about class size to be sure we could afford the teachers and the facilities. The only way to support small class size is to raise tuition dramatically.

- iii. **Mrs. Wilson** What are the odds that you will have two Kindergarten classes next year?
- iv. **Ms.** Alongi We probably won't know until November when we send out another survey. Will follow back up with Mrs. Wilson once we know more.
- v. **Ms**. **Heden** Need parents to 'grass roots' market Lourdes we have family community, faith based school and we are improving.
- vi. **Mrs**. **Wilson** Marketing on Arsenal page for Lourdes preschool. Problem comes with kindergarten class size of 25.
- vii. **Ms. Alongi** We have full time aid, we are faith based, and we are family oriented.
- viii. Fr. Chris May be best to advertise that if we have just 5 more kids in the future, we could split into two class sizes.

# 7. Strategic Initiatives Update (Puthoff, Veit, Reilly, Snyder, Willits) – No Report

# 8. Father Crossen's Report:

- 1. Met with Fr. Vrba about strategic plan of facilities. Fr Vrba will also get back to us about a SJV rep to LCS Board.
- 2. Facilities Decision on the horizon Stay where we are, or do we move facilities to another part of town look at possibilities for next 15-20 years. Will be forming a committee to study growth and needs of Catholic people in Bettendorf. Met with Fr. Vrba SJV is at capacity now and will have difficulty supporting more parishioners. Fr. Crossen will be putting together a committee to study needs of Catholic Church in Bettendorf. Fr. Vrba believes this is a great idea and is supportive of this initiative. Fr. Joe (LeClaire) also very supportive. Next steps to create presentation to Diocese Deanery, and present the slides to SJV parish council in November. A committee to study the community will be formed and comprised of BOE, Stewardship, Finance, Parish Council and Trustees. Proposed timeline: Data to Bishop by early winter. Next step would be to conduct feasibility study at Lourdes. Results of that would go to entire parish. General questions from meeting attendees:
  - 1. Will there be any studies for 'Bettendorf Community Catholic School'? Fr. Crossen: May lose identity with a parish it can be harder to connect to those families. This will be a question that will come out in the feasibility study. If SJV is interested in joint school, could be explored.
  - 2. What are the possibilities of Fr. Crossen rotating out during the potential capital campaign? Fr. Crossen hopes not; historically pastors with schools have stayed with the parish for 10-12 years. If we stay on good leadership/good path, diocese understands the need for priests to stay.

# **Teacher Report**

# **School-Wide Highlights:**

- First Prayer Buddy activity was September 8th to sign the Buddy Pledge and created a Buddy Card.
- Students sat with Prayer Buddies during Mass this week.
- First Round of Priest and Deacon visits
- Successful Curriculum Night in grades PK 8th grade

# **Classroom Highlights:**

**Pre-K-** We had Dave from the Wapsi Educational Center visit pre-k last week. He talked to the students about a turtle, a screech owl, their environments, habitats and more. Our first unit will be about trees so his visit tied in with our unit. We started our letter of the week with letter "L" today.

**Kindergarten-** We are moving through a full day of academics, social time, dancing, singing, and getting to know our everyday routines and procedures. Students are adjusting to kindergarten and expectations. They love going to specials and having three recesses. This year will be busy and fulfilling.

**First grade** - We have had a great start to the school year. This week we took our first math test over addition. In social studies we finished up our first lesson on how to get along in school and every also shared a "ME" bag to introduce themselves to each other. The big change in first grade is students now get their very own desk, instead of working at tables, so we are working on how to stay organized too.

Second grade- We have been working a bunch on classroom routines and getting used to being in the second grade classroom with a new teacher (to them). We also worked on our "circle of grace" curriculum during our religion times last week. In math, we took a pre-test over chapter 1 and are currently working on lessons that the students needed re-enforced from last year. In reading, we enjoyed reading A Bad Case of Stripes and we talked a lot about how others can influence our lives in good and bad ways because in the story, the main character refuses to eat her beloved lima beans because she perceives this to be too uncool for her friends at school and ends up with "a bad case of stripes" that is only cured once she eats lima beans. In social studies, we are getting ready to learn about communities and in science we are ready to start to look at a variety of materials we have on earth.

**Third grade-** We have been working with magnetic force. The children have been working with magnets and paper clips, collecting data and making predictions. In math we are reviewing our addition and subtraction facts and are learning about estimating in addition and subtraction. We have had fun watching caterpillars turn into Monarch butterflies.

Fourth grade - We have started Math Journals this year. Students are given a story problem prompt and together they work through the problem to lead into the unit or lesson to ignite background knowledge. During Language Arts, students have participated in stations to further practice conclusions and inferencing skills. In Science, students are continuing to learn about Living Systems. Each Wednesday, I have "Lunch Bunch." I have a different group of students eat lunch with me in our classroom. This is a great way for the students and I to get to know each other and build our classroom community. This Thursday is our first Class Mass with Father Crossen. The students are very excited and have been looking forward to it.

**Middle School** - On Friday Sept. 29th the 6-8th graders will travel to Veteran's Memorial Park for their annual Team Building Day. Jen Best from the Iowa State Extension Office will join them and with the help of Mrs. Johnson, lead small groups in team building activities. Students will also rotate through other activities led by the homeroom teachers and finish out the morning having lunch at the park.

# Policy and Procedure Review

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Policy 510.3 Class Size

Lourdes Catholic School understands the importance of the educational needs of its students for their academic, behavioral, social and spiritual development. The determination of class size will take the following considerations (in no particular order of importance):

- a. Age, curriculum, achievement and grade level
- b. Nature of instructional program
- c. Number of adults available to assist the program, including professional aides and certified instructors
- d. State regulations and school credentials needed to maintain accreditation
- e. Instructor credentials, skills, experience and administrative recommendations
- f. Financial needs of Lourdes Catholic School to remain a viable institution

The recommended maximum number of students per class per grade is:

- K-1: 25 students
- > 2-5: 26 students
- > 6-8: 28 students

Note: The above guidelines are recommendations, not requirements. The Administrator will determine if additional full or part time staffing is required, based on factors such as class size and instructional need. Recommendation for additional staffing will be presented by the Administrator to the Executive Committee of the Board of Education for consideration. If the Executive Committee approves the recommendation, it will then be presented to the full Board of Education for approval.
