What a great start to the new school year! Last week welcomed 255 students, K-8th grade. It is an exciting time with a 24% increase in K-8 enrollment. And that doesn't count our preschoolers who start later this week (preK) and next week (2- and 3-day). This is a very exciting time to be part of our community and I am glad you are here!
