There is a lot happening with the new school! I shared a picture last week of the land as it is being prepped for construction. There have been countless meetings to plan and design the layout and to choose everything from flooring to sinks to types of windows and a HVAC system. We are reaching some design deadlines in the next week and we are working hard and fast! This is a VERY EXCITING TIME, but I need your help. To date, only 10% of school families have submitted their pledge form for the new school campaign. The deadline for these pledges is only 19 days away (December 2nd and 3rd). We are trying to reach the goal of every school family giving to this campaign. Not meeting our goals means scaling back on the project and cutting plans for the new school.

It is important to show the community that the people directly affected by this are 100% behind the project!

Can you pause in your busy Monday to prayerfully consider how you will support this campaign? With the new legislation passing the ESA, this is going to save families a great deal of money. With the ESA covering up to \$7500/year for each child's tuition, consider contributing your current tuition amount. Also, ask your and your spouse's current employer if they offer a company match that will make your contribution go further.

Our children, community, and families for generations to come, are counting on your support for the new school. The Giving Tree in our courtyard was planted from a tiny acorn, many generations ago, and is now important to our kids. You have a chance, now, to plant a seed that grows much faster. We'll be in the NEW school in two years, but that needs to start today. It needs to start with each family doing what they can to help reach the goal.

I want to be able to go to meetings and to other donors and say "100% of our school families have given something to this project." Think of the power of that statement and the momentum it builds.

Report Cards

Report cards for the Quarter 1 Reporting Period were sent home on Friday. They are very different from what we are all used to. The event was a huge success as \$1075 was raised to go towards the 7th and 8th graders trip to Washington DC this summer. Transportation Reimbursement

Students who reside within BCSD **are now** eligible for transportation reimbursement because BCSD no longer provides bussing to Lourdes students. If you live over 2 miles from Lourdes in the Bettendorf School District you are eligible through BCSD.

<u>Bettendorf (BCSD)</u>, <u>Pleasant Valley (PV)</u>, <u>Davenport (DCSD)</u>, and <u>North Scott forms are provided at each of the links above.</u> You may print the form out for the school district within

whose boundaries you live, and send it in to the address at the bottom of your form as soon as you can. You can also email a copy to the appropriate school district. The contact information can be found at the bottom of each form.

December 1 is the hard deadline for the first semester, and we know from experience that the school districts do not make any exceptions.

Please do not mail or send your form to Lourdes. They must be sent directly to the appropriate school district.
